World Autism Month


What is World Autism Month?



A message from the CQA/ACC Board of Directors and Executive Director regarding



Quilt Canada 2020

We are closely following the circumstances of COVID-19 as it impacts communities and events internationally and at home. Just as you are, we are very concerned about the health and well-being of all of our members.

At this time we are cautiously optimistic that Quilt Canada will take place in Edmonton, June 18 – 20, 2020. We hope to provide a full program including the National Juried Show, concurrent quilt shows, workshops and day and evening lectures, over 70 vendors, and the Quilt Judge Certification Program.

We ask you for your patience. We know that vendors are preparing to stock their booths, teachers and lecturers are preparing their presentations and classes, the volunteers are preparing for their days of planning and setting up the show and the myriad of other tasks that they perform over the course of the show, and our Quilt Judge Certification Program leaders and students are also working to prepare curriculum and complete assignments. There has been so much time, talent and energy already expended in the lead up to our annual show. You may be aware that the Jury Coordinator and her team of judges have already spent weeks choosing the quilts that will be on display at the National Juried Show. And so many of you have already registered for workshops and lectures or bought your entry tickets. For all of these reasons, and more, we do not want to be too precipitous or hasty in our decision.

Our host venue, the Edmonton Convention Centre has indicated that they are very sensitive to the situation but have not as yet established a cancellation/postponement policy.

The Honourable Chrystia Freeland

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs



University—Rosedale

The Honourable Chrystia Freeland was first elected as a Member of Parliament for Toronto Centre in July 2013. She was elected as Member of Parliament for University— Rosedale in October 2015 and re-elected in October 2019.

From 2015 to 2017, Ms. Freeland served as Canada's Minister of International Trade, overseeing the successful negotiation of Canada's free trade agreement with the European Union, CETA. From January 2017 to November 2019, she served as Canada's Minister of Foreign Affairs.

An esteemed journalist and author, the Deputy Prime Minister was born in Peace River, Alberta. She was educated at Harvard University before continuing her studies on a Rhodes Scholarship at the University of Oxford.

After beginning her career in journalism as a Ukraine-based freelance reporter for the Financial Times, The Washington Post, and The Economist, she went on to various roles at the Financial Times. She then served as deputy editor of The Globe and Mail between 1999 and 2001, before returning to the Financial Times as deputy editor and then as the United States managing editor.

In 2010, she joined Canadian-owned Thomson Reuters. She was a managing director of the company and editor of consumer news when she decided to return home and enter politics in 2013.

Ms. Freeland has written two books: Sale of the Century: The Inside Story of the Second Russian Revolution (2000); and Plutocrats: The Rise of the New Global Super-Rich and the Fall of Everyone Else (2012). Plutocrats is an international best-seller and won the Lionel Gelber Prize and National Business Book Award.

In 2018, the Deputy Prime Minister was recognized as Foreign Policy's Diplomat of the Year and was also awarded the Eric M. Warburg Award by Atlantik-Brücke for her achievements in strengthening transatlantic ties.

Ms. Freeland speaks Russian, Ukrainian, Italian, French, and English, and lives in Toronto with her husband and three children. https://pm.gc.ca/en/cabinet/honourable-chrystia-freeland

SCRUB HATS (tie-back or elastic options)

Shelley K

Scrub caps are needed for the emergency departments of our hospitals. The nurses were recently told scrub caps were required on the job, but they are hard if not impossible to find. We will not be making masks or bags for hospital staff at this time. If we take on another project, we will communicate it through our email messages and newsletter.

The caps require 1/2 meter of cotton fabric; any colour or design. If you help you will find a simple pattern at the following link, https://www.lifebox.org/diy-scrub-cap-holiday-gift/. The preferred cap is the one with tie backs. There is a You Tube video from Man Sewing showing a variation of the scrub cap that includes the pattern, https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZykGWQ6iNuQ. Either one is fine.


The scrub caps will be picked up from your home. Call or text Shelley L at 306-552-8850. Put the hats in a bag and hang it on your doorstep. The hats will be picked up after 5 p.m. This project will end April 30, 2020.

Shelley L has reported as of April 4:




Shelley L will continue collecting scrub caps until the end of the month. If she gets more than requested they will not go to waste.



Tieback Hat Pattern


You will need:

- · 0.25m lining fabric (green)
- 0.25m exterior fabric (frogs)
- · Coordinating thread
- Scissors paper, embroidery and fabric
- Sellotape
- Chopstick/implement for pushing out corners
- Fabric marker
- Pins
- Ruler / Tape measure
- Paper pieces (print at 100%)




Method

1. Check paper pieces have printed to the correct scale by checking the 5cm mark on each sheet against a ruler/ tape measure



2. Assemble paper pieces by cutting out and sticking B/ B* and B** together where indicated




3. Press fabric



4. Fold each piece of fabric in half. Carefully pin Piece B to each fabric in turn and cut around. Take care on the exterior fabric that you can still fit in pattern piece A.



5. Take care to transfer the stitch line mark from the pattern onto the reverse side of pattern piece B. You only need to do this once (so pick the fabric the marks will show up better on).



6. You should now have Piece A & B in exterior fabric (frogs on my hat) and piece B in contrasting fabric (green)






7. Place the two B pieces together rightside together. Pin around the edge – the side with the markings should be uppermost. Stitch around the two pieces from sewing mark to sewing mark using a 3/8" seam. The top (curved) edge should be left open.



8. Clip neatly round the corners that you have just sewn to reduce bulk. Turn rightside out using the chopstick to fully push the corners out.



Hem piece A – press a double fold hem – 1cm first fold, 2cm second fold.
 Then stitch in place.



10. Making the hat - pin the top of the hat (A) onto the band (B). The easiest way to do this is to fold both pieces in half and line up the centre creases and thin pin all around the curve. Remember to pin exterior fabric rightside together (so frogs to frogs in my example)

11. Straight stitch around this pinned edge using a 3/8" seam allowance taking care to ensure the start and end points of your stitching line are secure as the nature of the design means they are stress points.
Zig Zag around the edge for neatness.



12. Wear or Gift your hat with pride.

To pass the time we have been trying new recipes. Here is my favourite so far:

Lentil Soup with Lemon

Ingredients

3 tablespoons olive oil 1 (32 ounce) carton chicken broth

1 large onion, chopped 1 cup red lentils

2 cloves garlic, minced 1 large carrot, diced

1 tablespoon tomato paste 2 tablespoons lemon juice, or to taste

1 teaspoon ground cumin 3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro

1/4 teaspoon kosher salt, or to taste 4 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil for drizzling

1 pinch chili powder

Heat 3 tablespoons of olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Stir in the onion and garlic, and cook until the onion has turned golden brown, about 5 minutes. Stir in the tomato paste, cumin, kosher salt, black pepper, and 1/8 teaspoon of chili powder. Cook and stir 2 minutes more until the spices are fragrant.

Stir in the chicken broth, lentils, and carrot. Bring to a boil over high heat, then reduce the heat to medium-low, cover, and simmer until the lentils are soft, about 30 minutes.

Pour half of the soup into a blender, filling the pitcher no more than halfway full. Hold down the lid of the blender with a folded kitchen towel, and carefully start the blender, using a few quick pulses to get the soup moving before leaving it on to puree. Puree in batches until smooth and pour into a clean pot. Alternately, you can use a stick blender and puree the soup right in the cooking pot. Do not puree all of the soup, leave it a little chunky.

NOTES:

Since we are trying to use up what we have these are the things we changed:

fresh tomatoes for tomato paste fresh chicken stock for carton more than a pinch of chili powder



Being prepared

The World Health Organization (WHO) has assessed COVID-19 as a pandemic. The assessment by the WHO is not unexpected.

In Canada, our health system is prepared for this situation. Since the outset, the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC)—along with public health authorities at all levels of government across the country have been working together to ensure that our preparedness and response measures are appropriate and adaptable, based on the latest science and the evolving situation.

There is an increased risk of more severe outcomes for Canadians:

- aged 65 and over
- with compromised immune systems
- with underlying medical conditions

Our public health efforts will continue to focus on containment to delay the onset of community spread by rapidly identifying cases, meticulously finding close contacts and using tried and true public health measures such as isolation and social distancing.

In the event of community transmission, these actions will continue as long as feasible to interrupt chains of transmission in the community and to delay and reduce an outbreak where possible.

In order to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19, everyone has a role to play. It takes more than governments and action from the health sector to protect the health and safety of Canadians. Each of us can help our country be prepared in the event of an emergency by understanding how coronavirus spreads and how to prevent illness.

For individuals

Canadians should continue to think ahead about the actions that they can take to stay healthy and prevent the spread of any illness, especially respiratory infections.

Now and always during cold and flu season, stay home if you are sick. Encourage those you know are sick to stay home until they no longer have symptoms.

Since respiratory viruses, such as the one that causes COVID-19, are spread through contact, change how you greet one another. Instead of a handshake, a kiss or a hug, a friendly wave or elbow bump is less likely to expose you to respiratory viruses.

Practise frequent hand hygiene and coughing and sneezing etiquette. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces, such as toys and door handles.

These are the most important ways that you can protect yourself and your family from respiratory illness, including COVID-19.


Membership- Cheryl A reported 68 members, 1 new member and 1 guest present.


