

Scrappy Mystery Quilt 2022-2023

April 2023 Mystery Quilt Block

by Tannis Fahlman

Size: 52 x 56 without borders and up to 66 x 70 with borders



Directions

Sew $2\frac{1}{2}$ square of black and $2\frac{1}{2}$ square of background together. Press towards darker fabric.

Sew 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ square of background and 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ rectangle of black together. Press towards darker fabric

Sew the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ squares to the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ square background. Press. Sew the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ strip onto the previously sewn

fabrics. Making sure the black is touching in the corner The finished block will be 6 ½ square.

Make 4

Fabric

Background	2 ½ Sq- 8	4 ½ Sq -4	
Black	2 ½ Sq- 4	2 ½ x 4 ½ - 4	

Meeting Minutes

Prairie Piecemakers Quilters' Guild General Membership Meeting Minutes

2022 Nov 1

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Pres Sharon at 7:02 pm.

2. Minutes of Last Meeting

Motion: Heather I/Dianne P that the minutes of the Oct 4th meeting be approved. Carried.

3. Program - Jacquie

Jacquie talked about the non-profit organization Quilts for Survivors (for survivors of the residential school system) and her involvement with them. Since the charity started, 2,251 quilts have been given. The charity keeps a data base of who has applied for a quilt and who has received one. Jacquie and some friends have been making quilts and donating them – with an emphasis on supporting Saskatchewan based survivors. As part of this involvement, she has learned more about the residential schools and the impact that they have had on the indigenous community.

- 4. President's Report Sharon
- The first shopping day will be Sunday, November 6 from 1:00 to 4:00. All Christmas fabric will be 30% off and there will be some guild members there demonstrating sewing machines.
- The next retreat will be in March, sign-up information is in the newsletter.
- At the last meeting, a member proposed that we should consider making quilts for the James Smith Cree Nation. Sharon explained that the guild is prepared to support this kind of initiative, but cannot undertake to organize it. In the case of the Humboldt crash, it was a local Humboldt quilt store that put the call out for quilts and various members of our guild supported it. This matches the philosophy of Connecting Threads, where members make quilts and they are donated to other organizations who distribute the quilts as they see fit.
- 5. Library Dianne

Three donations of books have been received and are being placed in the library.

6. Moose Jaw Quilt Show - Colleen

The Moose Jaw Quilt Show will take place April 21-22 at the curling centre (a new venue). Colleen encouraged our members to place quilts in the show, and to attend, possibly making a day of visiting Moose Jaw.

Tannis talked about how to calculate yardage for a quilt – highlighting the rule of 40 – always assume there is 40" in a width of fabric (WOF).

10. Workshops – Aline

November 26 class will be on organizing, cutting and using scraps to make beautiful quilts. It will be given by

Sherrill Anne Taylor. Aline showed samples of scrappy guilts made by Sherrill.

- December's meeting will be a party with a penny parade, some snacks and some information.
- January, February and March meetings will all be on Zoom. The presenters for those meetings will be Jen Houlden in January, John MacPhail in February, and Cheryl Arkinson in March.

12. Strip Poker

People were divided into teams. Each person had four strips of fabric. They played a game with dice and the

person who ended with all the fabric won. The game was well received.

13. Membership - Cheryl

65 members were present in person, and 9 were online. We also had 3 visitors, of which 1 joined the guild.
