



President's Message January 2020







Ingredients:
1 onion diced
4 stalks of celery chopped
2 tbsp garlic
4-6 roma tomatoes blanched and peeled
2 large can diced tomatoes
seasoning salt
pepper
onion powder
4-6 tbsp fresh chopped basil(to taste)

Cook onions, celery and garlic in oil Add remaining ingredients, bring to a boil, blend with immersion blender until desired consistancy. Simmer 1-2 hours













Make 2 - 12 1/2" x 6 1/2" bocks

Make 2-12 1/2" x 6 1/2" blocks



Make 4 - 12 ½" x 6 ½" blocks

Fabric requirements for 8- 12 1/2" x 6 1/2" blocks

B- Background 6 - 7 ½" sq.

Fabric 1B 2-7 ½" sq. Fabric 1C 2-7 ½" sq. Fabric 1A 4-2 5/8" x 8" 4-2 5/8" x 10"

Fabric 2B 2-25/8" x 8" 2-25/8" x 10" Fabric 2C 2-25/8" x 8" 2-25/8" x 10"

Cut 2 fabric B 7 ½" squares diagonally twice. These will be used for the bottom triangle of all 8 blocks Cut remaining 7 ½" squares 4- B, 2-1B, 2-1C diagonally once. These are your upper left and right triangles





Sewing Instructions. Match square edge of your 7 ½" sq. background triangle (cut diagonally twice) to fabric 1A 2 5/8" x 8" along the right side leaving a long tail at the bottom. Sew seam and press. Figure 1

Matching top edge Sew 1A- 2 5/8" x 10" to other side and press leave tails Figure 2

Sew background fabric 7 ½" sq. (cut diagonally once) on to right side of 1A leaving a ½" tail at the top. Don't worry about the bottom. Press. Sew on background triangle onto left side and press. Trim block to 12 ½" x 6 ½", making sure you get correct points at the bottom and ¾" seam allowance above the top point.

Make 7 more blocks using the correct fabrics

Make 2 - 12 ½" by 6 ½" blocks

Make 4 – 6 ½" blocks

Fabric requirements for 6 Blocks

B- Background 2-3 ½" x 6 ½", 8 = 3 ½" sq. 6-4 ½" sq.

Fabric 1B 1-7 ½" sq. Fabric 1A 4-3 ½" sq.

Fabric 2C 4-3 1/2" sq. Fabric 2A 1 - 7 1/2" sq.

Cut fabric 1B and 2A 7 ½" squares diagonally twice. You will only use 2 of 1B. Cut all 6-background fabric 4 ½" squares diagonally once

Make 2 flying geese using 1B and background fabric. Sew background fabric onto the right side of fabric 1B making sure to leave a ½" inch tail on the top edge

Sew seam and press. Sew another background triangle onto the left side and press. Trim to 3 ½" x 6 ½" – leaving a ½" seam allowance above 1B triangle.

Sew background 3 ½" x 6 ½" on top of unit. Sew 2C- 3 ½" squares to B = 3 ½" squares. Sew 2C units onto sides of flying geese units making sure 2C is on top. Press trim to 12 ½" x 6 ½". Make 2 blocks

Make 4 flying geese using 2A and background fabric. Using the same method as above. Trim to 3 ½" x 6 ½". Sew 1A and background fabric 3 ½" squares together. Sew 1A units onto the top of the flying geese making sure to have fabric 1A on the left side. Make 4 -6 ½" inch blocks.

CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP



from The Encyclopedia of Creative Cooking edited by Charlotte Turgeon

~ served by Shelley K. at Christmas Party

3 pounds chicken, cut up

1 tablespoon salt

Water to cover

1 cup sliced carrots

1 1/2 cups chopped celery with leaves

1/2 cup chopped onion

1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning

1 tablespoon dehydrated parsley flakes


1 cup (about 1/4 pound) uncooked noodles

Simmer chicken in salted water in covered saucepan until tender. (A frying chicken will take about 45 minutes.) Remove chicken from broth; cool enough to handle. Remove skin and bones; chop meat.

Skim most fat from broth; measure broth. Add water, if needed, to make 5 cups; bring to boil. Add chicken, vegetables and poultry seasoning; simmer, covered, 20 minutes. Add parsley and noodles; simmer, uncovered, 10 minutes or until noodles are tender. Yield 6 servings.





My quilting style is all over the place. See it, like it and do it! I do like quilts with many pieces and a challenge.




What is your best quilting tip?

We will post the list of vendors on our website in April once all arrangements have been completed.





Dear Fellow Quilters:

Debbie W has outdone herself again this month with five new books for the library!

(I believe a theme is developing here.)

Mini Wonderful Curves 16 Seasonal Quilt Projects Using the QCR Mini by Jenny Pedigo and Helen Robinson for Sew Kind of Wonderful with Sherilyn Mortensen: Title and subtitle tell it all—you will need the QCR Mini ruler to complete the projects in the group. There is a chapter on how to use the ruler and then the book gets down to projects, 16 in all such as #arewethereyet, Sea Glass, Bat Moon Rising.

Jelly Roll Bargello Quilts by

Karin Hellaby for those bargello enthusiasts out there. There is a chapter on "Fabric and Tools"; "Jelly roll Bargello Basics"; "General Instructions" and then 19 separate projects such as "Venetian Carnival", "Pink Meets Blue in Verona", and "I Love Cervina".

Trendy Table 2 Featuring 15 Designs by Heather Peterson of Anka's Treasures. Some of the table runner instructions need the Creative Grids 60-degree Triangle ruler (CGRT-60). The author includes general instructions and then on to the projects such as Sunkissed, Confetti Runner, Hollyhocks Runner. Some of the

projects include size options so the

project can be something other than

Stashtastic! 12 Patterns for Fat-Quarter Quilts by

a table runner.

Doug Leko (Each Quilt in 2 Colorways). The author founded Antler Quilt Designs in 2008 when he was 14 years old. The projects include "Short Circuit", "French Twist", "Classic Mosaic". I especially liked the quilt "Country Roads" as it is a play on my favourite block, Log Cabin with a unique twist.

Scrap-Basket Bounty 16 Single Block Quilts That Make Your Scraps Shine by Kim Brackett. The first chapter discusses One-Block Quilts and how they can present many design possibilities including Blocks with Diagonals and Asymmetrical Blocks. An essential rule (and possibly the only rule the author suggests is that the colours of the main fabrics of the blocks contrast with background fabrics. "Three-Patch Chain", "Pinwheels at Play" and "Candy Canes" are 3 of the 16 projects.

So Quilters—do come and check out the library, in the Board Room, entrance opposite the Ladies' Room. You will be greeted by smiling faces of the library crew—Kathy W., Wendy S., Debbie W., Linda W., and me Bonnie R (or I may be grumpy just for some variety!)






Announcements - Shelley updated us on some of the CQA news and advised us to check out their website for more information on the conference coming up in Edmonton, Alberta in June 2020.
