**February Meeting**- Dana E. Jones, artist, quiltmaker and journalist, is author of Pagtinabangay: The Quilts and Quiltmakers of Caohagan Island, which shares the story of quiltmaking on a 13-acre island in the central Philippines. Dana is a former editor of Quilters Newsletter magazine and the Studio Art Quilt Associates Journal. She has had articles and/or pattern and block designs published in numerous magazines.

She has spoken and taught at International Quilt Festival in Houston and American Quilter's Society shows. She is a regular teacher at Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and quilt shops across Colorado, and has spoken and taught for quilt guilds and shops across the United States and Canada. Dana offers open enrollment classes via Zoom. The most popular are "Demystifying Design for Foundation Paper Piecing" and "Peace Cranes Over Hiroshima."

Her quilts have been exhibited at Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and as part of the 2018 American Quilt Study Group traveling exhibition. She lives at 9,200 feet in the Rocky Mountains in Gilpin County, Colorado, northwest of Denver.



This year we donated 668 quilts – 1 more than last year.

Peds Units at RGH and WRC received 229, KidsFirst – 78, CadioScience – 28, 4 Directions – 81, Allan Blair – 82, NICU – 160 and 10 to other organizations and

individuals. We also donated 253 pillowcases and 120 chemo bottle bags.

If all our donated quilts from the past 6 years were laid out, they would cover a football field.

Over the past 9 years, we have donated a total of 4877 quilts, 2079 pillowcases and 2458 placemats.

These donations would not be possible if not for the many donations of quilting fabric to make these items by the public and our Guild members. We also received a SaskEnergy "Share the Warmth" grant this year. We are very thankful for these as our group could not achieve the number of donations without this support Guild Challenge for 2023-24

**Be Sustainable** 



The challenge this year is to repurpose fabric into something new. These fabrics can be used clothing, bedding, table linens, upholstery, etc. The quilted project must be made from at least 75% used materials with unused fabric scraps from your stash making up the remainder of the quilt. If you have to purchase any fabric for your project, it should come from a thrift shop, garage sale, etc.

The same rule will apply to the back of the quilt. Hint: bed sheets make great backing!

Your quilt or object must not be longer than 85 inches. It can be wearable, a quilted object, a bag, wall hanging, etc. Where ever your imagination takes you!

All projects will be shown at the May 2, 2024 meeting. Each person will be given a number and Guild members will vote for viewer choice. **Please do not put your name on the front of your project or the index card.**



The draw will be held at the quilt show in May.


