



### Prairie Peacemakers Fall Dallas Valley Quilters Retreat

### Oct 14 - 17, 2021

Given the current limitations of Sask Health Guidelines (and we understand they will change) we are setting the amount of people for the Fall retreat to 20 participants — so that each quilter has a single room and sewing station with required spacing.

At 20 people this event will pay for itself so the fees may be slightly higher but we do need a minimum of 20 participants for the event to proceed. Estimated cost per person based on 20 participates is \$350.00 per person - This is only an estimate.

If guidelines, vaccinations, etc go well, this event could increase to 30 participants and shared rooms will be come available and costs will be slightly decreased. Our intention is to follow ALL Sask Health Guidelines to make this a safe space for all participants.



At the present time I have received less than 20 names and since it is less than 20, they will automatically be lottery winners. I have replied to each email so that you know I have received it and that means you are in!!!! (Dot L. and Penny F. you are both in.)

If we do not reach 20 members by middle of August then we will open to other guilds, family and friends to fill the seats so that the event can proceed.

All participants will be contacted by the middle of August to confirm their participation.


Deposits will not be required at this time – Full payment will need to be paid by Oct 5 guild meeting.


Among the 18 participants, we had a total of 212 UFO's to complete. In the last 7 months a total of 108 UFO's have been completed.





I was born and raised on PEI and I learned to shear sheep from my Dad (Valdis Petersen), who started taking me with him when I was about 10. My brother and I would work with him for the summers. We started with bagging wool, catching sheep, trimming hooves. We started learning to shear around 15. We travelled the maritimes covering most of NB, NS, and PE. As we got older and better at shearing, we acquired more flocks and even did some trips into northern Quebec and into the US. I started doing flocks on my own when I was 17. Some of my customers I have known since that time, and they have become like family to me.

### She shears sheep by the seashore – and in PEI, she's the last of her breed



Ms. Petersen, 36, is the last professional sheep shearer on Prince Edward Island, a job few people want to do any more because it's exhausting, tricky, tough work. She handles about 9,000 animals a year, a workload that's left its mark on her body: a pinched nerve in her arm that keeps her up at night, aching knees, throbbing wrists, sore hips. "If you can learn to shear, you can learn to do anything in life," she said, with sweat dripping off her nose.

### Quilt Discovery Experience

### Wild Goose Chase

Nature was an obvious and rich source for quilt patterns. There are numerous patterns named for trees, flowers, animals and birds.



The homesteaders watched the migration of flocks of geese and created quilts with that in mind. Although the triangle shape is used in hundreds of other quilt designs, in this quilt block, triangles represent the geese. Pioneer women expressed their artistic abilities and creativity in the way they arranged the triangles or geese, and in the colors they used. That may be one reason why the Wild Goose Chase pattern has at least 14 variations.

Other patterns that reflect nature include Bear Paw, Dove in the Window, Hen and Chickens, Dogwood and Sunflower.

Quilting was not just a woman's activity. Over the years, men have also been quilters. In fact, when they were boys, at least two presidents, Calvin Coolidge and Dwight D. Eisenhower, helped their mothers piece quilts.

### Free Motion Quilting with Freezer Paper

WATCH NOW

Free motion quilting can be tricky to get the hang of when you are just starting out. One thing that can make it easier and less intimidating is drawing or transferring the quilting design or motif onto the quilt top or project.

Ashley Hough shows you how to do this using freezer paper, which eliminates the need to draw directly on the fabric.

Using Freezer Paper

Ashley begins by talking about the type of paper to use. You can use a standard freezer paper or any other kind of wax backed paper. The idea is that when the paper is 'fused' to the fabric using medium heat, dry iron – the paper temporarily sticks to the fabric. The paper can then be easily removed, moved, and reused as many times as the paper will still stick to the fabric.

You can then use the design as a way to free motion quilt and trace the outer edges and quilt that shape onto your project, or do simple free motion quilting fill stitches around the design and leave that area un-stitched. While you can always stitch through the paper when quilting as a way to use it as a template, however, if you do so, you will need to rip the paper in order to remove it, making it non-reusable.



Learning how to square up fabric before cutting any pieces for your next quilt is an important lesson. Heather Thomas teaches you how she squares up fabric after it has been pre-washed and gets it ready to be used.

Heather also gives tips on what size of ruler she likes to use when squaring up fabric as well as tips on how to best hold the ruler so it doesn't move when cutting. Once you have your fabric square you can cut all of your pieces and begin working on your next quilt.



### A short history of Indigenous blankets in Canada

As an Indigenous research archivist for Library and Archives Canada, Elizabeth Kawenaa Montour is familiar with the history of Indigenous blankets in Canada. 





### Virtual Showcase Celebrates Student Applied Learning Research Projects


