

NOVEMBER 2019 TO OCTOBER 2020
Winter temperatures will be slightly higher than normal, on average, with above-normal precipitation. The coldest periods will occur in early January, mid-January through early February, and late February into early March. Snowfall will be below normal in the west and above normal elsewhere, with the snowiest periods in mid-November, mid-December, early January, early February, and from late March into early April. April and May will be cooler and rainier than normal. Summer will be hotter and rainier than normal, with the hottest periods in mid- and late June and early and mid-July. September and October will be warmer than normal, with near-normal

precipitation.





Guild Table



What: An opportunity to sell your unused quilting fabrics and supplies so that you can turn them into cold hard cash and buy new quilting treasures! Well priced goods can net a significant payout. We will sell your items for a 20% commission that goes back to the Guild. We will also be accepting donations of items from Guild members as a Guild fundraiser.

Things that sell well: quilting fabrics or scraps priced for quick sale; patterns; quilt kits; magazines; quilting books; rulers; etc. All items went quickly at the last Quilt Show, especially books and magazines (no older than 10 years old please). Larger items that were priced for quick sale sold well too.

Where: Evraz Place, Banner Hall, within the area of the Quilt Show, with a visible sign or banner.

When: The quilt show will be held Friday and Saturday May 8 & 9, 2020.

Item Drop off: Sherrill and her Committee will be at Banner Hall on Thursday, May 7th, between 10 - 6 pm to check in your premarked items. If this time will not work for you, you can make other arrangements by calling or texting Sherrill @ (639) 915-0314. You will need to mark and record your own items so be prepared to take the time!! Please mark items in amounts of \$2 or higher. We will use the double tag approach again, plus record sheets with your vendor number and desired price on them. To make effective tags, simply sew a line of holes along the long side of an index card and cut your tags, marking on both your vendor number and your desired price.

Contact Sherrill to get your "vendor number" and the forms early so that you can do this at home.

Unsold Item Pick up: Saturday, May 9th - anytime after 6:00 pm. You will be given your sale amounts in envelopes, less the 20% Guild commission, at the June 2020 Guild meeting.

Things to Think About: if you are offering goods for sale, please consider volunteering for a shift at the Guild Table (it is fun anyway!). Don't be afraid to bring larger items – we have even sold sewing machines in the past! FQs and yardage sells better when presented in Ziploc bags; many Ziploc bags also have a white space that you can mark your price and vendor number on. Larger clear plastic food trays also display nicely. Coordinated grouped FQs sold well. Packing tape, painter's tape and masking tape usually sticks well but not always. If you are using stick-on labels, test them at home to make sure they stick! If we don't know who owns it, we can't sell it! Good quality scraps can be sold in larger zip lock bags.

Suggested prices (NOT written in stone!): Four or five magazines tied up with curly ribbon sold for \$3.00; Patterns \$2 each or up to 50% off retail price; Fat Quarters \$1-2 each depending on quality – remember that some vendors will be selling theirs for \$2.00+; Older books \$3 or \$4 and newer books can sell for up to 50% off retail price. Donated books, magazines, and yardage are great Guild fundraisers if you choose to donate them.



When we receive your entry form, we'll send you a Quilt ID Tag and a Claim Tag. Quilters who are not members of our guild must enclose an entry fee of \$15 to cover all of your entries. There is no limit to the number of entries per person. Please choose your category carefully to ensure that quilts are judged and displayed in the most appropriate category.

Two - Create your quilt and package it

Complete your quilt, and package it in a fabric bag. Label the back of the quilt and the bag clearly with your name, address, and phone number – include the Quilt ID Tag.

Three – Drop off or send your quilt - Please deliver your quilt between 7 pm and 9 pm Monday May 4, 2020.

Drop off locations will be provided to entrant upon receipt of show entry.

If you live outside Regina you may mail or courier your quilts to Shelley Kloczko by May 1st. Request the mailing address by e-mail (ppqgreg@gmailcom) or by phone 306-585-3449.Regina quilters, if you are unable to deliver your pieces during the specified time, please make alternate arrangements.

Four - claim your quilts

Quilts must be picked up at the Queensbury Convention Centre, Banner Hall on Saturday May 9 between 5 pm and 5:30 pm unless alternate arrangements have been made.



Debbie W. has found us three books on strips and strings: **Stripology Mixology, Classic to Contemporary String Quilts, Strip-Pieced Bargello** and one maverick, **Quilt As-You-Go Made Vintage**.

Quilt As-You-Go Made Vintage by Jera Brandvig. The cover promises "51 Blocks, 9 Projects, 3 Joining Methods." Method 1 is Block to Block Assembly where you make a block, quilt it directly onto batting, trim and sew to the next block, pressing seams open. There is no sashing in this type of quilt. Method 2 is Joining Strips on the Front; the strips will look like sashing. Method 3 is Joining Strips on the Front and Back; in this method you quilt all three layers (block, batting, backing) and then using strips on the front and back, put the blocks together.

In **Stripology Mixology**, the author Gudrun Erla gives us both quilt patterns and quilting methods along with drink mix recipes, but to me the best part of the book is how she uses her 1 ½" and 2 ½" strips and 5" and 10" squares to create eye-popping quilts. This is a keeper. In addition to the how-tos, she gives you the fabric needed and blocks need for crib, lap, twin/full, queen and king quilts. Best of all—lots of straight lines which is my first love in quilting. In "Camilla, the basic block is shown in 5 separate layouts".

And finally, Strip-Pieced Bargello *Dynamic Quilts Step by Step* by Judith Steele. Have you ever admired a Bargello quilt for is beauty and intricacy and then backed away from doing your own because of the teensey little pieces? With this book and the author's unique method of sewing the strips together and then making a tube of the strings (the book's illustrations make it much clearer) followed by cutting the tube crosswise and then making new strips by unpicking different seams and you have your Bargello.

Classic to Contemporary String Quilts by Mary

M. Hogan has something for everyone: if you like classic, like Dresden Plate, you can do it with strings. If you like modern, there are blocks with lots of negative space accented by strings. And if you like just plain chaos, there are strings (crooked strings, disappearing strings, selvage strings, pieced strings and skinny strings) to assist. There are 13 projects which include table toppers, wall hangings, and quilts.*



Guild Table at Quilt Show - Vendor numbers are available from Sherrill T for anyone wanting to sell items at the Guild Table.


Membership – Cheryl A advised that there were 68 members (including 1 new member) and 1 guest.
