President's Pearls

In a year without much happening, sometimes I feel like there isn't much to write about. Therefore I thought I'd turn this month to something that's bringing me a lot of joy every single day. And that joy has come in the form of a Temperature Quilt. While at first it seemed like a big undertaking, I can't tell you how much I'm enjoying it.

In late December I bought a lovely range of bright colours in Kona cotton from a local quilt shop. I also found a great coordinating fabric to use as a border, sashing to separate months, and as a filler for the months that don't have 31 days. I'm doing the temperature high and low for each day. Somedays I step to the sewing machine and put in two rectangles with colours representing the previous day. Sometime I wait a week or two and put in the multi-coloured rectangles.

The overall effect is that I think about this quilt every day. I'm checking the temperatures every day. And even when we've had spikes in highs and lows, I find myself rooting for that temperature to go just a little higher or lower so it goes into a different colour bracket.

The other effect is that it's another thing that is taking my mind off of what's going on in the world around us - and the monotony of the feeling that things seem to be same every day.



I've also been plotting and planning my project for the *Breakfast at Tiffany's Challenge.* I've just bought some fabric. Again it's Kona cotton, in that beautiful blue that is synonymous with Tiffany and Company. Tiffanys may have played a major part of the name, but such a minor part of the book and movie. But I believe using fabric that makes me happy, because life is too short for ugly fabric! That iconic robin's egg blue that been linked to Tiffanys for decades is one of my favourite colours. I'm excited to get moving on my project.

> I'm going to sign off so that I can get back to the sewing machine. Stay safe and keep quilting.



Prairie Peacemakers Fall Dallas Valley Quilters Retreat



- The way we are going to do sign up is hopefully the fairest way we can go about doing this with the intent to give everyone a chance to sign up if they wish to attend. Given the current limitations of Sask Health Guidelines (and we understand they will change) we are setting the amount of people for the Fall retreat to 20 participants – so that each quilter has a single room and sewing station with required spacing.
- At 20 people this event will pay for itself so the fees may be slightly higher but we do need a minimum of 20 participants for the event to proceed. Estimated cost per person based on 20 participates is \$350.00 per person this is only an estimate.
- If guidelines, vaccinations, etc. go well, this event will increase to 30 participants and shared rooms will be come available and costs will be slightly decreased. Our intention is to follow **ALL** Sask Health Guidelines to make this a safe space for all participants.

If you want to participate - Follow these simple steps :

Apr 15th – June 1st

- Send your name/phone number in an email to saskgirl1971@gmail.com between the dates above if you would like your name put into the lottery draw for the Fall Retreat. Your email may have more that one person listed but it is a lottery so names will be drawn separately
- Any emails received before April 15th will not be accepted I will look to see if there is a question and if not the email will be deleted. You will have to resubmit an email in the

timeframe stated above. You can not place your name into the lottery before April 15th.

June 7th meeting we will draw for the 20 spots - you do not have to be online during the draw as your name will stand until we contact you and you say otherwise. The lottery winners will be contacted by the middle of August to confirm their participation and receive their forms/payment structure. Deposits will not be required at this time – full payment will

need to be paid by Oct 5th guild meeting.

If your name was not drawn or you sent an email after June 1st then your name will go into

the second lottery draw which will take place on September 7th, 2021 at the guild meeting – this draw will take place if there are spots available. After this meeting if there is still spaces once the second lottery has happened we will open to other guilds, family and friends.

- Sask Health guidelines will be followed at the retreat venue whatever they may be at that time masks in common areas, work space set up, etc.
- Forms will be sent out at a later date closer to the retreat as well as payment plan information.

Friendship Quilt

The quilts the homesteaders brought with them were a comfort to these women who traded their home, family and friends in the East, for the uncertainty of traveling through vast prairies in the West. A quilt that held special value to the pioneer women was the Friendship Quilt.



Often it was done is secret, and then given to the woman as a going away gift. It usually was a group effort, with each block being sewn by a friend or relative with their name embroidered in the center.

Putting a Friendship quilt on the bed, gave a woman a sense of connection with her former way of life. It kept alive the memory of family and friends, providing comfort and company during the difficult days of homesteading.

One woman homesteader said, "When I get lonely, I read the names on my quilt. "It was like putting her arms around someone and giving them a hug.

What is Lutradur?

Lutradur is a spun-bond polyester stabilizer and it comes in two weights, 70 grams, and 100 grams. The 70-gram Lutradur melts easier and at a lower heat, whereas the 100-gram Lutradur is more difficult to melt but better to print on.

Painting Lutradur

This medium is wonderful for added dimension in your mixed media projects.



Photo Printing

Lutradur is also a great medium for printing photos on. If you plan to do this, however, you will need to first prepare it with one of the following preparation tools:

- . Digital Ground Medium,
- . Ink Aid, or
- . Bubble Jet Set

These mediums need to be painted onto Lutradur, first painting in one direction with a paintbrush and then paint in the opposite direction. You can paint left to right, right to left, top to bottom, bottom to top; just make sure it is covered if you plan to use it in your printer.



The Right Tools

For this hand stitching tip all you need is a ruler and a marking pen. Because of where you will be doing the marking a regular ball point pen is recommended rather than a fabric pen or pencil. Ashley first explains that where you will be doing your marking depends on how you hold your fabric when stitching. She demonstrates how she holds her fabric, explaining that how you hold your fabric may even change depending on the type of hand stitching you are doing.

- Since 2017 Frances and I have been the team bringing you the newsletter every month. She has decided to retire from her position at the end of this year. I'm sad but also thankful for her excellent contribution over the years. Our advertisers love working with her and she will leave the newsletter advertising in very good working order.

Please consider taking over from her and work with me next year to serve the guild members. New input - fresh ideas 😄

Newsletter Frances L. - advertising
