

Modern Circles or Squares and Rectangles Applique Class November 9, 2019

Starting with a solid or pieced background, I will show you a fast and simple way to applique. The applique method I will teach you is a turned edge machine applique that closely mimics hand applique using freezer paper. With this method the appliques are soft and flexible without needing to cut your quilt or remove freezer paper. We will draw circle, square or rectangle applique motifs onto the wash away sheets. Glue the sheet to your applique fabric. Sew the motif onto your project. Wash the sheet away.



Quilt Canada Make A Mini!





20/20 Endless Visions Quilt Show Quilt Categories



S-1: Max perimeter 160". Hand or machine quilted.

M-2: Hand Quilted or Hand Applique. Made and hand quilted and/or hand appliqued by you Max perimeter 280".

M-3: Self-machine quilted. Max perimeter 280". Made and quilted by you on any size machine. Stipulate whether using longarm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph and/or stitch regulator.

M-4: Machine quilted by someone else. Max perimeter 280". Stipulate whether using longarm, sit-down machine, pantograph, computerized program, and/or stitch regulator.

M-5: Kit, Workshop, or Store Sample Max perimeter 280. Stipulate who quilted it and whether using longarm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph and/or stitch regulator.

L-6: Hand Quilted or Hand Applique. Made and hand quilted and/or hand appliqued by you. More than 280" perimeter.

L-7: Self-machine quilted. More than 280" perimeter. Made and quilted by you on any size machine. Stipulate whether using longarm, sit-down machine, pantograph, computerized program, and/or stitch regulator.

L-8: Machine quilted by someone else. More than 280" perimeter. Stipulate whether using longarm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

L-9: Kit, Workshop, or Store Sample More than 280" perimeter. Stipulate who quilted it and whether using longarm, sitdown machine, computerized program, pantograph and/or stitch regulator.

I-10: Innovative Quilt. Maximum perimeter 280". Enter the brave new world of art quilts. Show us your original creation, using a variety of materials, not from a pattern or kit. Three dimensional elements such as fabric folding or embellishments are applicable. Be sure to list all of the interesting materials you used.

11: New Generation Quilters. For quilters 16 years of age or younger, this is for you. Quilt of any size using any technique.

12: Group Quilt. Completed by 3 or more people, any size. What have you and your quilting friends stitched up lately?

13: Recycled. Give recycled fabrics or material a second life, any size. 50% of the top must be from recycled fabric or material. Tell us what you started with. No 3 dimensional elements or garments.

14: Modern Quilt. Max 240" perimeter. Modern bed or wall quilts depict modern design and demonstrate personal expression and originality in the design, colour and/or techniques. Minimalism, asymmetry, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work are often a part of modern quilt compositions, as are improvisational piecing and solid fabrics. (Taken from CQA National Juried Show) Stipulate who quilted it and whether using longarm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph and/or stitch regulator.

15: Modern Quilt More than 240" perimeter, Modern quilt as described in 14. Stipulate who quilted it and whether using longarm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph and/or stitch regulator.

16: Assorted Quilted Items: table cloths, placemats, runners, bowls & boxes, bags, cushions, etc.



Fabric Requirements for 8 blocks

Background 4-3 ½" x 6 ½" 12-3 ½" sq.

Fabric 1C 2-7 ¼" sq. 4-3 ½" sq. Fabric 1B 2 - 7 ¼" sq. 4-3 ½" sq.

Fabric 2C 2-7 ¼" sq. Fabric 2B 2-7 ¼" sq. Fabric 2D 4-3 ½" sq. (these need to be cut from Fabric 2D. they were not included in your Sept issue)

Sewing Instructions

Using your own method make 4 half sq. triangle blocks with Fabric 1C and 2C and trim to 6 ½" Make 4 half square triangle blocks with fabric 1B and 2B. trim to 6 ½"

Sew2- 6 ½ squares together making sure you have the correct orientation and noting the left and right blocks. Make 2 of each block

Sew background 3 ½" sq. to fabric 1B. Sew background 3 ½ x 6 ½" rectangles on top. Make a 4 patch with background fabric, 2D and 1C.

Sew2- 6 ½ squares together making sure you have the correct orientation and noting the left and right blocks. Make 2 of each block

Prairie Piecemakers Quilters' Guild Regular Monthly Meeting – October 1, 2019 prepared by Sherrill T

Welcome & Call to Order – The President, Shelley K. called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

Approval of Meeting Minutes – Heather I. pointed out the Workshop report was from Heather I. and Iris L. Motion to accept the change made by Sharon G. The motion was seconded by Sharon G. The correction will appear in the November Newsletter. Library – Bonnie R. let everyone know that they were holding a book sale tonight in the Library. Books on sale were from a donation made by an estate and those being culled from the library. The sale was going quite well as they only had 10-12 books left at that time. She reminded us that the Library has been relocated to the Boardroom, down the hall opposite the women's washroom. Workshop – Heather I. brought everyone up to date on the Guild's

latest offerings. October 5th, will see members attending the Modern Slice & Insert Workshop being taught by one of our own

members, Ruth B. The November 9th Modern Circles, Squares or Rectangles Applique Class still has some openings and is being facilitated by another of our members, Lori T. Samples for both workshops were on display to woo participants. Also announced was the December 7 Workshop which will feature yet another one of our members teaching. Making Fabric Books by Heather G. Look for details in the November Newsletter.

Retreats – Jacquie B. announced that the 2020 Dallas Valley Retreat is once again a sell-out. Once she and Roanne D. have a chance to go through the registrations, they will let the participants know if their room and tablemate choices can be accommodated. **UFO Challenge** – Heather H. advised she is happy to have so many people signed up and she expects to be able to make up at least 3 teams of 8. Anyone who hasn't turned in their UFO list to Heather yet, may do so up until the November meeting, but please let her know your intention so she can attempt to group the teams evenly.

Show & Share - was held, with various members showing beautiful completed quilted pieces. We encourage all members to participate in this fun event throughout the year. Even beginners have something to offer, so don't be shy. Please bring something you've made to inspire us all.

Announcements – Marlene SC. Announced that we had received 2 thank-you notes. One was from the two winners of the \$500 CQA Viewer's Choice Award which our Guild sponsored. The second was from the recipient of a quilt donated to the hospital. The recipient says 'this precious quilt was such an uplifting moment in a difficult time'.

President's Challenge – Shelley K. referred members to page 5 of the October Newsletter to check out the 20/20 themed challenge and invited everyone to consider participating. A viewing will be held during the April 7, 2020 Guild Meeting and a prize will be awarded through a random drawing of those participating. CQA Challenge – Shelley K. reminded us about the Canadian Quilters' Association Challenge for their 2020 Quilt Show and asked members if anyone was interested in participating – 3 members indicated they would, so she will let CQA know to expect an entry from our Guild. Details outlining the requirements for submissions can be found on page 13 of the October Newsletter and the CQA website. Their theme for 2020 is Gateway to Adventure. Shelley K. has been keeping pace with the 52 Block in 52 Weeks Challenge and showed us her latest blocks.

Mystery Quilt – Tannis F. indicated she had received a lot of feedback after the initial release in September. In an effort to clear up confusion, the September instructions have been reprinted in the October Newsletter, along with the October instructions. If you have already completed your September blocks, DO NOT remake them – simply follow along and make the October blocks. Tannis clarified the fabric choices – you will need 2 main colours and 1 background. If you would like to use more than just 3 fabrics in your quilt, take and break up each of your 2 main colours into 4 fabrics – each having a Dark, Medium Dark, Medium and Light. She reminded us that we can avoid a lot of the confusion typical of a mystery quilt by using the color swatch chart as a guide.

2020 Quilt Show Update – Tannis F. indicated that the leads are in place for all the areas, the theme picked, the logo created and that plans are well under way. She thanked Jymmi-Kaye D. for replacing Jacquie B. as lead for Quilt Show Set Up and Dismantle. Shelley K. explained changes have been made to entry categories and are outlined on Page 15. In an effort to ensure everyone is given credit for the effort put into making the quilts, changes have been made in regard to sizing and what kind of machines were used to create your quilt. There is even a new category for quilts made from kits. This info will be reprinted in the November newsletter in an effort to keep everyone informed. If anyone has questions about which category your quilt should be entered into, please ask an Executive Member for assistance.

Program – Program was a 2-part event tonight. Shelby L. invited members who completed tops and finished quilts featuring Tannis F.'s mystery pattern from last year to show them off. Wow, so much variation - a beautiful sight. Good job folks and a great big thank you to Tannis for creating the pattern and letting us play along! The second part of our program invited members to show quilted items they had embellished. A wonderful show of unique quilts and bags were displayed using everything from beads and sequins to doilies, lace, and yo-yos. It was nice to see such a variety of techniques and items employed in creating this beautiful art.

Membership – Cheryl A. advised that we had 80 members in attendance tonight and 7 guests and returning members. She reminded us all to remember to check-in at meetings to ensure accurate numbers can be recorded.

Door Prizes – Winners tonight were Terri F., Trina M. and Linda B. 50/50 – KC H. was tonight's winner and she received \$113!
