

The Thrills and Spills of Fabric Dyeing.


On our journey we will use **Procion MX dyes** as a reactive **dye** and as an acid **dye**, increasing the creative opportunities and expanding the color range possible.

Procion MX dyes are just what you need for assemblage dyeing, where you can create a collection of fibres, threads and fabrics that are perfectly colour co-ordinated for a particular project.

We'll be looking at various ways of creating exciting colour schemes on fabrics, using low water immersion, as well as painting your own

Paperless Piecing

October 23rd from 9-4 pm Instructor: Lori Tourscher Saskabilities Centre \$35.00



Using freezer paper is my go-to method for paper piecing - it's accurate, with no messy paper removal. This technique uses the same numbered pattern that you might use in Paper Piecing, but you don't stitch through the paper. When the block is done, the freezer paper pulls off easily because it has not been stitched through.

In the class you get to choose the pattern that you want to paper piece and I will teach you the technique of how to paper piece using freezer paper. I will give you lots of pointers and tips as we work through you pattern.

If there is a waiting list for the workshop, the Workshop Committee will share the names on the waiting list for you to contact.


Some of our workshops rely on a certain number of participants to cover the expenses. We are trying to keep the costs, as reasonable as possible.

<u>Dallas Valley Quilters Retreat – October 14th to October 17th, 2021</u>

We will be staying overnight for 3 nights and will have 3 meals a day plus a snack. You can quilt 24 hours a day if you wish, as the sewing room is separate from the sleeping quarters.

The current estimated cost is \$300.00 per person. The more people who sign up, the lower the cost per person will be.

Tannis F. has designed a mystery quilt, as yet unnamed, best name submitted at the putting it together workshop in April wins a prize. Please note that this is a group collaboration as Tannis did the creative work and Heather I., Shelley K., and Marlene S-C. were the testers.

All the blocks of the Mystery quilt are traditional, but they are assembled in a modern way.

The Mystery Quilt is intended to be skill building along the way, for example, how to tackle curves, pressing, trimming. We start with the hardest (for me) block. There is a new block each of September to March and our efforts culminate in the April Workshop.

You are asked to sign up to keep our printing costs down (necessary templates, paper piecing).

For simplicity's sake, colours have been called, dark, medium, and light. The background can be either dark or light. You may use scraps for Colours 2 to 4 should you choose. (I will have examples of fabric to illustrate a light background and a dark background.)

Assembled top, without any border, approximately 54" x 66".

Fabric Needed:

Colour 1, Background, 4.75 m*

Colour 2, approximately 1.5 m

Colour 3, approximately .6 m

Colour 4, approximately .5 m


Colour 5, approximately .5 m (stripes cut *parallel to the* selvedge)

^{*}This will give you enough for a 2" border and binding should you choose to complete the quilt using Background.

Abbreviations Used: WOF Width of Fabric RS right side of fabric RH right hand




<u>DRUNKARD's PATH</u>—each block is a 6 1/2" square(to *finish* as a 6" square)

Can use template to draw, then cut, or to trace onto freezer paper then cut or use your template to cut directly—whatever works for you.

Needed: Templates A (Crust) and B (Pie) Colour 1 (Background Fabric) for Crust

Colour 2 (Pie) Colour 4 (Pie)

Ruler that is at least 6 ½" square—must have ¼" markings



From Colour 1: Cut 3 - 7" strips WOF Subcut each WOF into 10" x 7" rectangles. Place two 10" x 7" with RS together. Using template A (Crust), cut one with corner of Crust in upper LH corner and one with corner of Crust in lower RH corner. They fit together closely; be careful not to cut the short straight sides of the Crust too far.

Need 21 Crusts from Colour 1.

From Colour 2: Cut 2 - 6 1/2" WOF strips.

Subcut each WOF into 6 ½" x 18" rectangles.

Fold each $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" in half, RS together. Using template B (Pie), cut 2 Pies, then open up and cut a third.

Need 10 Pies from Colour 2.

From Colour 4: Cut 2 - 6 ½" x WOF strips.

Subcut each WOF into 6 ½" x 18" rectangles.

Fold each $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" in half, RS together. Using template B (Pie) cut 2 Pies, then open up and cut a third.

Need 11 Pies from Colour 4.

Piecing: 1/4" seam. (Check your seam on scraps before you start.)


Lay Pie RS up. Lay crust RS down. *Note: Crust is always on top. The magic happens when you trim.*

Match edge, sew ¼" seam curved edges together.

Make 10 blocks with Colour 2 and 11 blocks with Colour 4.

<u>Pressing:</u> Carefully finger press the seam, for Colour 2 press seam to Crust. For Colour 4, press seam to Pie. By doing this they will nest together. Finish *pressing* with your iron. Be aware of aggressive pressing and/or ironing—each frequently leads to distortion of block.


<u>Trimming</u>: Lay the block RS up with the <u>corner of or the</u> straight sides of the Pie in your upper RH corner. The first 2 cuts will be on the straight sides of the Pie. Line up the 5 ¾" mark on each of the seams top and bottom. Trim such that each straight side of the Pie is 5 ¾".



Rotate your block such that the straight sides of the crust are now in the upper RH corner. The next 2 cuts will be on the straight sides of the Crust. Line up the 6 ½" mark on each of the seams top and bottom. Trim such that the straight side of the Crust is 6 ½".

See Diagrams 1 (Pie) and 2 (Crust).

You will have 21 completed Drunkard's Path blocks. Set aside for April's workshop.





I can't believe it - another quilting year has gone by, the summer is over and Fall is about to begin. Last year was a very successful quilting year with many unfinished projects completed. In 2021, we are again going to have the UFO Challenge. I hope to have as many participants as last year. For those quilters who have never participated, or need a reminder, the following details should help explain the process.

A **UFO** is an **unfinished object**, one that you have started previous to **September 1**, **2021**. The CHALLENGE is to complete these items to give your Team points, and maybe win a prize. I randomly create teams after the October meeting, based on how many participants/UFO's.

The guild member enters the name of the quilted item (please provide some details), along with the size (perimeter in inches) on the challenge register sheet. Each completed item with a label will earn an extra point. The completed lists must be returned to me, no later than October 25, 2021.



At the same time keep a copy for yourself of the list as a reminder of what you have to finish and show at the guild. The team that shows the most completed items on their lists will win.

When you bring/show your finished items to the meeting, show them to Challenge Coordinator, (me) Renee B. I will check them off your list and at the end of the night tally team points. Showing your completed UFO at the meeting will give guild members an opportunity to enjoy the quilts at the show and share time.

This Challenge is all about FUN - Cleaning out your quilting room, completing projects that have been collecting fabric fairy dusts for months. The more space – the more fabric you can buy!!

Now that summer is winding down, it's time to make fall plans.

We will start on Thur Sept 9 ...

I am attaching guidelines for making quilts also.
I will send another e-mail closer to our start date with any updates.

1. NICU Quilts:

- make these **between 36 40 inches in length and width**. Anything smaller than this size is too small for donation. The flannelette for the backing will be cut in 1 metre lengths and will be provided at Connecting Threads.
- use the label with the teddy bear on it.

2. Other quilts:

- quilts larger than the ones for NICU are donated to a number of agencies. Babies/small kids at RGH and Wascana Rehab Pediatric Units get quilts so they don't have to be a large size. Make all quilts any size up to about 60 x 85 inches or a size that you are comfortable quilting. We can donate any size as they are "comfort quilts" and seldom "bed quilts". Use a label without the teddy bear on it.

3. Bindings:

- bindings can be applied by hand or machine.
- If applying by hand, the stitches should be no more than about 1/8 in length. According to the judges at our 2018 quilt show, if you can push a coffee stir stick into the seam (the kind from Starbucks or any pricey coffee shop!), the stitches will not hold up to frequent washing. They recommended machine stitching the binding on any quilt that will be washed frequently. Here is your chance to use all those stitches on your machine!!!!

4. Odour on Fabric:

- we occasionally will receive fabric that has an odour, usually from storage. Wash it in detergent/fabric softener that is scent-free (before or after sewing) as most of our quilts are donated to the hospitals and should be scent free. All the NICU quilts are washed by the RN that delivers them to the unit.

5. Prices on Quilts:

- -we have had a number of people interested in buying our quilts. We have had generous offers so here is a guideline if someone wishes to purchase your donation quilt:
 - baby size \$75
 - kid's size \$150
 - lap size or larger \$250 \$400

This is just a <u>guideline</u> so use your own judgment. All funds will go into purchasing products needed by Connecting Threads.

6. Adhesive Spray:

-we are not allowed to use any spray (such as 505) when layering the quilts at the Neil Balkwill.





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

"I have heard from Canadians who describe a renewed sense of possibility for our country and hope that I can bring people together," she said in her address. "Every day, inside small community halls, school gyms, Royal Canadian Legions, places of worship, and in thousands of community service organizations, there are ordinary Canadians doing extraordinary things. As governor general I will never lose sight of this — that our selflessness is one of our great strengths as a nation. I pledge to be there for all Canadians."

While the installation ceremony was smaller than in previous years, due to COVID-19 public health measures, it still offered some of the familiar pomp associated with the vice-regal position, including a 21-gun salute. It was also punctuated by nods to Simon's heritage, including the lighting of a Qulliq, a traditional Inuit oil lamp used to light and warm the home.

Simon brings an extensive resume with her to Rideau Hall, following a career that included various positions as an advocate and ambassador. She helped negotiate the James Bay and Northern Quebec Agreement in 1975, a landmark deal between the Cree and Inuit in Quebec's north, the provincial government and Hydro-Québec.

Quilting Activism: How Canadian Quilters Can Get Involved

Founded in 2017 by sewing and quilting author and pattern designer Sara Trail, the Social Justice Sewing Academy (SJSA) is a US-based not-for-profit youth education program that bridges artistic expression with activism to advocate for social justice. Focused on quilting, SJSA aims to create an intergenerational quilting bee by connecting quilters and textile artists of all ages and backgrounds through the power of activist art.



While SJSA is based in the States, quilters from around the world are invited to become volunteers. Canadian quilters can sign up to embroider a youth-made quilt block or longarm finished quilt, create Remembrance Project blocks, or make a Quilt of Remembrance. Quilters from Canada are encouraged to get involved, and would be especially welcomed to the Remembrance project to help raise awareness of Canadians who were the victims of community violence. Interest in sustainability in the quilting, home sewing, and crafting markets continues to grow. We see quilts, garments, and other crafts using upcycled, repurposed, and found materials. Mending continues to provide a creative way to showcase our skills and create beauty in garments and other items that need a little love. Sustainably grown cotton is becoming a mainstream commodity. Organic cotton production and organic certifications continue to increase. Recycled fabrics are becoming more popular and shops dedicated to deadstock, scrap material, and leftover craft supplies have increased exponentially over the last several years. Consumers are willing to pay more for sustainably produced goods and there's a certain level of confidence when purchasing items with third-party certifications.

The quilting and crafting industries should not be immune to these necessary changes and consumer demands. In fact, consumers need the industry to lead.

Over the last year and a half, we've built a board, created a website for Create and Sustain loaded with useful information, and have been working towards launching this initiative. We don't have all the answers yet, but we hope, in time, that we will. Our vision at Create and Sustain is to be THE source in the industry for all things sustainable. This includes education about certifications, how climate change disproportionately affects BIPOC/lower socio-economic communities, upcycling, green projects, webinars, highlighting companies, and makers that are making decisions that consider environmental impact, creating tiers of sustainability, and so much more.




